ADVANCED DEGREES, ADJUSTMENT IN RESTRICTION OF AWARD OF: The Senate approved a plan to restrict the award of advanced degrees to members of the University faculty ~~above~~ the rank of instructor and to members of the administration of higher rank, with provision that this restriction be effective at the close of the second semester, 1950-51. *and below* *not*

REMOVAL OF "D" GRADE RE SCHOLARSHIP DISQUALIFICATION: The Senate adopted the following interpretation of the present catalogue statement regarding removal of a "D" grade: "A conditional failing grade of "D" which is included in the credits constituting fifty per cent failure may not be removed during the period of disqualification."

The Senate also voted to adopt the following statement of policy: "A student disqualified from the University of Arizona may not transfer credit from another institution when such credit has been completed during the period of his disqualification."

MEMBERSHIP, CHANGE IN: The resignation of Professor N. D. Houghton as a member of the Senate was accepted, and Professor Russell Ewing was elected to fill the unexpired term, ending on January 1, 1951.

BY-LAWS RE ELECTIONS, INTERPRETATION OF: In connection with the election of Dr. Ewing as a member of the Senate, it was voted so to interpret the By-Laws that a person who is elected to fill an unexpired term shall not be ineligible to serve two full terms in his own right, if the unexpired term he fills is not more than half of a regular term.

CLASSIFICATION OF STAFF MEMBERS, APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE RE: On the recommendation of the Committee of Eleven, the Senate voted authorization of the appointment by the President of a committee to study the classification of certain categories of the University staff members, particularly with respect to their status under the Faculty constitution. It was provided that the Committee will be composed of members from the administration and from the faculty.

ARIZONA STATE COLLEGE ASSOCIATION, MEETING OF: It was announced that the next meeting of the Arizona College Association will be held on Saturday, December 16, at Arizona State College at Tempe. The speaker will be Dr. W. H. Cowley of Stanford University. The hope was expressed that as many members of the Faculty as possible would attend the December meeting.
